- 9. **Colossians 3:12-17:** Paul writes about the virtues Christians should clothe themselves with, including compassion, kindness, and patience, and emphasizes doing everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, which resonates with Peter's advice on serving to glorify God.
- 10.**Acts 2:42-47:** The early church's devotion to the apostles' teaching, fellowship, breaking of bread, prayer, and sharing everything in common showcases the practical outworking of Peter's instructions in a community context.
