Recap

Recap of the Sermon and Summary of the Text

In Romans 12:3-8, Paul continues his exhortation on Christian living by addressing the attitudes and behaviors necessary for a healthy church family. 8. **1 Timothy 4:14:** Paul advises Timothy not to neglect his gift, which was given through prophecy when the elders laid their hands on him, stressing the importance of recognizing and using one's spiritual gifts.
9. **1 Corinthians 4:7:** Paul reminds believers that everything they have is received from God, encouraging humility and the recognition that gifts are given by God's grace, resonating with Romans 12:3.
10. **1 Thessalonians 5:11:** Paul encourages the Thessalonians to build each other up, a concept that is intrinsic to the proper use of spiritual gifts within the church.
